#### **Steve Maviglio, Forza Communications, The Majority Report**

One of California's most prominent political strategists, Steven Maviglio has worked in political communications and campaigns for more than 25 years during which time he was Deputy Chief of Staff for Assembly Speakers Karen Bass and Fabian Nunez, Press Secretary for Governor Gray Davis and provided strategic communication and political advice to the Speaker and the Assembly Democratic Caucus. Maviglio also served in the Clinton Administration.

#### **Eric McGhee, Public Policy Institute of California**

Public Policy Institute of California Research Fellow Eric McGhee, a former Congressional Fellow, has in-depth expertise in the area of elections, legislative behavior, political participation and public opinion.

#### **Rosalind Gold, National Association of Latino Elected Officials**

Rosalind Gold has been NALEO's Senior Director of Policy, Research, and Advocacy for over 10 years and has extensive policy expertise in the areas of election reform, voting rights and the decennial Census. She serves on the advisory committees and boards of several public affairs and research efforts, including the Institute on Money in State Politics.

#### **Trudy Schafer, League of Women Voters**

Ms. Schafer has been Senior Director for Program at League of Women Voters of California since 1992 and a League member since 1978. Her advocacy has included campaign finance and budget reform measures, redistricting reform, clean money elections, single-payer health care, and inclusion of smart growth principles in infrastructure bonds.
